EXTRA. 2 O'CLOCK. THE END NEAR

Hopes of a General Railway Strike Go Below Zero at Buffalo.

Chief Arthur Won't Come, and Nobody Else Appeared This Morning.

Little Interest in the Session of the State Board of Arbitration.

A Central Strike at Rochester Suspended Pending Efforts at Adjustment.

Buffalo, Aug. 24.—This day brings the opening of the hearing by the State Arbitration Board as to the causes and circumstances of the recent strike of switchmen in the railway yards here.

In advance there is very little general interest in the hearing, expectancy as to the arrival of the executive heads of labor orders and speculation as to what will be done at their conference, constitutes all there is of interest to the general public in the situation this morning.

No tidings of extraordinary happenings during the night come out of the camps.

Chief Arthur, of the engineers, has, it is believed, indicated to Mr. Sweeney, of the switchmen's order, that it will be "impossible" for him to be present here at the proposed conference. This is construed to mean that the engineers' order will have nothing to do with the switchmen's difficulties, and that the engineers' order will not co-operate in a sympathetic strike.

Discouraging to Mr. Sweeney. Reasoning from this, some conclusions may be reached. Mr. Sargent will not take out his men to aid Mr. Sweeney's men unless all organized railway men also go out. Mr. Arthur's men will not come out; therefore Mr. Sargent's men will not come out; and these facts leave the conductors, the trainmen and the railway telegraphers as the field in which Mr. Sweeney must search for aid in his difficulty.

The conductors and telegraphers, it is believed, have little in common with the switchmen, and the trainmen are more closely associated with other orders than with the switchmen.

Mr. Sargent announced yesterday that he would leave the city this afternoon, going to his home. Hence Mr. Sweeney must consummate his conference to-day or conduct it without the presence of Mr. Sargent, unless, indeed, Mr. Sargent should return, which is not deemed probable.

The impossibility of Mr. Arthur's attendance, or his refusal to participate, has taken the edge of public interest in Mr. Sweeney's conference, and it is now believed that, with Mr. Sargent departing to-day no positive results to Mr. Sweeney's advantage will flow from the council he has called.

Mr. Sweeney himself recognizes the situation as quickly as any other person, and public feeling here is that he will adopt one or two widely different courses—either to declare officially that his followers have been defeated by the companies who once employed them or to call out all the other switchmen on the lines that were affected by the recent strike of switchmen in this city.

Status of the Strikers. Meantime there are strikes on three roads, the West New York, whose switchmen went out Monday, and on the Lackawanna and Buffalo, Rochester and Pittsburg, whose switchmen quit yesterday afternoon.

Shore and Erie, and the other lines originally involved in the switchmen's campaign. Messrs. Sweeney and Sargent expected Chiefs Clark and Wilkinson, of the Conductors and trainmen respectively at an early hour this morning, but at this writing they have not appeared and there is growing impatience over the delay.

There is a suggestion made that Clark and Wilkinson may have dropped off at Cleveland to consult with Chief Arthur, of the engineers.

Rioters in Supreme Court. The conviction has grown here that Police Justice King, of this city, before whom arrested strikers have been arraigned for violence, has been dealing with them in a manner too lenient. Hence, the four riotous strikers who were committed to Manahar, who yesterday shot by a Twenty-second Regiment picket, were to-day arraigned not before the Police Justice, but before Judge Green, of the Supreme Court. They were committed to await the action of the Grand Jury.

Manahar this morning gave his statement to the Coroner. He will die, it is believed.

SMALL STRIKE AT ROCHESTER. Central Switchmen Want Double Pay for Sunday Work. (BY ASSOCIATED PRESS.) ROCHESTER, Aug. 24.—The night force of New York Central switchmen employed at East Rochester, ten men in all, struck at 4 o'clock this morning, demanding double pay for Sunday work.

When the day force of twelve men came to the yards Assistant Division Superintendent Good consulted with them, and they decided to go to work pending a settlement of their grievance by the heads of the road at New York. All at work now.

CROWDED WITH BUSINESS. Jersey City Freight Yards Packed with Incoming Trains. There are no indications that inconvenience in handling traffic is felt at any of the railroad terminals in Jersey City today. The equipments of the yards are in full operation and trains are arriving so rapidly that the yard forces are obliged to work with unusual energy in order to handle the incoming freight.

At the Erie yards there is a great rush and Yardmaster Marvin is obliged to work his men over time to accommodate shippers. Freight via Buffalo is being shipped as rapidly as it is possible to make up and despatch trains, and the incoming trains are arriving at such a rate that the yard force has to work with unusual energy to handle the freight.

The Lehigh Valley road has also resumed business at the normal rate in all branches, and the crews at Fort Liberty and Conowingo are severely taxed to handle the rush of business.

D. L. and W. officials anticipate no trouble at this end of the line, and declare that the strike, so far as they are concerned, at Buffalo is a thing of the past, and that they will do their business to any appreciable extent.
