WHERE SHOT IS MADE.

Progress of Rough Lead Into Bullets Traced.

Drops of Molten Metal That Reach "Killing Perfection" by a Fall.

From One of the Towers Reporters Used to Watch Hangings in the Tombs.

The queer little elevator that hoisted the visitor up to this floor brought up for the day's work a truck-load of pigs of lead, each weighing eight pounds, and another truck-load of molten metal which was being poured into which has been tumbled a certain percentage of arsenic, which has a tendency to harden the lead when it is necessary.

Occasionally, by the manipulation of a baby elevator, he brought up a pepper-box full of shot from the depths below, and emptied it into a tin can, which he then took to the kitchen.
