Disgusted Holders Dump New England in Big Blocks.

WALL STREET, Thursday, Oct. 27. - Naturally enough after yesterday's developments concerning the great Reading deal, all eyes were riveted upon New England stock at the Exchange this morning.

The disappointed ones slammed their stock on the market, and asserted with confidence that the road would be squeezed by the Reading on one side and the Boston & Maine on the other.

The dealings at the start were attended with great excitement. Large blocks changed hands and various prices were paid at the same moment.

The enormous traffic on the western roads and the certainty of an immense passenger traffic on account of the World's Fair led to encourage holders of the trangers, and the shares held with good support.
