FATHER CORRIGAN'S TRIAL.

It Will Probably Be Resumed To-Morrow Afternoon.

There is a temporary lull today in the trial of Rev. Father Corrigan, pastor of the Roman Catholic church of Our Lady of Grace, in Hoboken, for alleged insulting language and insubordination towards his ecclesiastical superior, Bishop Wigger, in connection with the holding of the German Catholic Congress in Newark in October.

Although three hours were spent in the session yesterday virtually nothing was accomplished in the matter of hearing the issues in dispute, and when an adjournment was taken until to-morrow afternoon it was for the purpose of citing and hearing witnesses who could throw light on the question raised whether Vicar-General O'Connor, the judge of the trial, was sufficiently unbiased to act in his judicial capacity.

BRIGGS TRIAL RESUMED.

His Defense to the Charge of Heresy is in Order To-Day.

The trial of Prof. Charles A. Briggs, of the Union Theological Seminary, charged with publishing and teaching doctrines alleged to be heretical, goes on this afternoon before the New York Presbytery in the Scotch Presbyterian Church on West Fourteenth street.

The accused preacher may, however, first raise the question of the jurisdiction of the Presbytery in the case, and if that question is decided in his favor, the trial will be postponed.

The members of the Prosecuting Committee occupied three days in their argument, and it is not probable that less time will be taken by Rev. Dr. Briggs before he is set through with his voluminous and intricate argument.

\$11,100 MORE WANTED.

The Hamilton Bank's Claim Against Ex-President Pinkham.

The Hamilton Bank, of Harlem, wants \$11,100 more from Charles B. Pinkham, Jr., the former President of the Bank of Harlem, and has used in the Supreme Court for that amount, alleged to be due on a promissory note given by Pinkham to the Bank of Harlem prior to the troubles which ended in the consolidation of the two banks last year.

Mr. Pinkham says he owes nothing; that the note was given at the time of his trouble with the bank to allow him to draw on the bank, and that he has suffered financially to the extent of \$15,000 through the action of the bank.

Mines Have Been on Fire Since 1869.

(BY ASSOCIATED PRESS.) VIRGINIA, Nev., Dec. 13.—In the old ore slopes of the Consolidated California and Virginia mines a fire which has been burning since 1868, has but a fourth so far as work on the 1,650 and the 1,750 levels has been abandoned.
