PENILESS WANDERERS. Italian Mother and Children May Become Paupers. An Italian immigrant who gave her name as Mary Felice, and her two children, Anna and Rosa, aged respectively two and four years, were brought before Justice White, in Jefferson Market Police Court this morning, charged with vagrancy.

The woman, with her children, was found wandering about Washington Square yesterday afternoon. She stated that she had been employed as a domestic in the household of a gentleman in Lafayette place, but that she had been discharged on the 19th, and that they were bound on their island on suspicion of being paupers.

He learned that her husband resides in Little Rock, Ariz., and communicated with him with the result that the husband promised to send money by telegraphic order to pay their fare to him.

The agent secured the release of the trio and brought them to the Society's rooms, but the woman, being dissatisfied and ran away. Justice White instructed the officer and the children to be taken to Broadway where the money was to have been sent, and if it was not there to return Mrs. Felice and her children to this house.

ACCUSES HER BROTHER-IN-LAW. Mrs. Hirsch Says Arnold Has Written Blackmailing Letters to Her. The examination of C. G. Arnold, a salesman employed by Charles Baring & Co., of 434 Broome street, and living at 70 East One Hundred and Twenty-second street, on a charge of blackmail, was adjourned in Jefferson Market Court this morning until 3 p. m. Friday.

The complainant is Mrs. Annie Hirsch, a young widow living with her two children at 280 Lenox avenue. Mrs. Hirsch and the defendant were sisters. They are both beautiful women, the one being a brunette and the other a blonde. The connection between the two women is a well-known fact, and the fact that the two women are evidently well-to-do, and that their words and actions when facing each other in court this morning seemed indicative of a kindly disagreement rather than sisterly affection.

In her affidavit Mrs. Hirsch alleges that divers persons, whose names she cites, have received letters from Arnold maligning her character, the intent and purpose being to create the impression that she was unfit to associate with modest women and good men. The last letter was received by herself Dec. 15. It contained an indirect proposition touching in language of the filthiest description. She claims to have positive proof of Arnold's guilt.

Arnold denies the charge and declares that Hirsch is accused by a spirit of spite and revenge.
