GUTTENBURG RACE TRACK, Feb. 13.—Although the weather was about as stormy as it could possibly be, the racing at Guttenburg was continued to-day as though it were the middle of July.

The attendance was slim and among those who wandered around the ring were about one hundred Italian laborers, who had been engaged to shovel the snow and haul from the track. This class of people did not bet, consequently the seventeen bookmakers who drew for positions did anything but a lively and profitable business.

The track—well, it was difficult to determine what kind of shape it was in. At any rate there was an abundance of snow to make it a trifle unsafe.

The opening event for me maidens of all ages at six furlongs. All of the six named to go faced the starter. They were a poor lot, but the talent made them a 4 to 5 chance. Kerry Gow led clear to the stretch, when he cut, badly down, and the favorite, who had been an easy winner.

Panhandle was said to be a cinch for the second race, and when he opened at 4 to 5 there was such a rush to back him that 4 to 5 was all that could be had about him at the close. He was never prominent in the race and finished absolutely last. Belle D., the winner, made all the running after the first yard.

Azrael was made a 3 to 5 chance for the third race, and getting several lengths the best of a bad start, he headed the race. Of the dozen named to go in, fourth race, Freeman and Seabright were the only ones to decline the issue. It was a very open betting race, and Marcellus, who went to the front a slight favor, was quoted at 4 to 1.

It was a bad start, with Marcellus, the second choice, leading. He was the best of the race, but he was not in the money. Marcellus finishing half a length before Philura, who beat Sir Davy out of the place.
