

### SLINEY'S DEATH DAY.

Fixed for the Week Beginning Monday, April 10.

Bob Lyons's Murderer Resentenced To-Day by Justice Ingraham.

An Affecting Interview with His Mother—His Father's Death.

Michael T. Sliney, whose conviction of the murder of Butcher "Bob" Lyons at 123 Cherry street, the afternoon of Nov. 25, 1891, was confirmed by the Court of Appeals, was brought down from Sing Sing this morning for resentence.

The prisoner was in charge of State Detective Jackson, and entered the Court of Oyer and Terminer at precisely 10.30. A moment later Justice Ingraham entered the court, and Assistant District-Attorney Wellman moved that sentence be pronounced.

Mr. House, Chief of House, counsel for the prisoner, interposed an objection, on the ground that the Court had not jurisdiction. This objection was overruled, and Sliney was told to stand up.

When asked if he had anything to say why the sentence of death should not be pronounced, Sliney shook his head, and then said: "I have nothing to say, your honor. I have done my duty, and I am ready to die."





SENATOR E. P. HAGAN.




GEORGE WHITE.
