

LAST EDITION. CORBETT'S CASH UP.

Brady Hands Blanchard a \$10,000 Check in Boston. "When Mitchell Covers It the Match is Made." The Subject of Signing Articles Carefully Avoided.

BOSTON, Feb. 24.—The \$10,000 representing Corbett's stake in his match with Charley Mitchell was posted for the second time this morning at 10:30 by W. A. Brady, Corbett's manager, with David H. Blanchard, who has been agreed upon as arbitrator.

It remains with the Englishman to put up his \$10,000 to complete the match. There is scarcely a doubt that he will do so, and his money is expected in every mail.

Mr. Brady arrived from New York at 7 o'clock this morning, accompanied by Howard B. Hackett, a New York newspaper man, in an interview with Mr. Brady this morning that gentleman said:

"All that Mitchell has to do to complete the match is to put up his money. Mine is up in the form of a certified check, which the stakeholder has agreed to accept."

"How about signing articles?" was asked. "I can't say anything about that. When Mitchell's money is up the match is made. We have got to keep very quiet about this whole affair on account of the trouble given us by the police in New York."

"Will you go to Niagara to sign articles?" "No, nor to any other place."

As I said before, the match is made as soon as Corbett's money is covered, and that is all I can say. It is illegal, under the laws of New York, to go out of that state for the purpose of arranging a match, and if it could be proved I would be liable to arrest for so doing. It doesn't make any difference whether we go to Canada or Honolulu, the fact that we went out of the state of New York to make a match would constitute the offense."
