Fatal Fire in a Henry Street Double Tenement This Morning.

DUO TO OIL-STOVE EXPLOSION.

All the Children in One Family Killed by the Smoke.

THEY WERE LOCKED IN A ROOM.

Pitiful Anguish of the Parents Who Lost Their Little Ones.

Five children were suffocated in a \$5,000 tenement-house fire at 194 Henry street this morning. Four of the children were of one family. These are the dead.

The house is one of the kind known as "double deckers." It is six stories high and sixteen families live in it.

Two stories on the ground floor are occupied by R. Jacobs as a bakery and by Jacob Levy as a butcher shop.

This morning's was the second fatal fire in the house. April 20, 1891, there was a fire on the first floor, in which two children were suffocated.

Caused by a stove explosion.

Like many tenement-house fires, this morning's blaze was caused by the explosion of an oil stove.

At 7:45 this morning she was engaged in cooking breakfast, when the oil stove which she was using caught fire.

In vain Mrs. Netter endeavored to extinguish the flames, and suddenly the blazing stove exploded, setting fire to the apartments. Hastily seizing their sleeping children, Mrs. and Mrs. Netter fled to the street, their cries alarming the other tenants.

EXTRA. GAY CAPITAL CITY

Washington Puts On Its Brightest Hues for the Inauguration.

CROWDED TO ITS OUTER DOORS

Cleveland Warmly Welcomed - He Calls on Mr. Harrison To-Day.

TAMMANY IS EVERYWHERE.

Weather Prospects, Gloomy in the Morning, Brighter as Noon Comes On.

WASHINGTON, March 3.—The Capital City is in the midst of the preliminary hurly-burly of inauguration time.

There are no formal ceremonies to-day, but, what with trying to see all the city's sights and catch a glimpse, at least, of all the celebrities gathered here, the great crowds of visitors are kept very busy.

The vicinity of the White House is the scene of the constant busting of a changing throng. The hotels where well-known statesmen are quartered also have their big groups and their excitements.

But the biggest crowd of all which gathered this morning was in the immediate neighborhood of the Arlington, where President-elect Cleveland and his party have their quarters.

The reception of people at this point began last night, as the hour approached when the arrival of the distinguished party was expected.

It has been kept up at reasonable and unobtrusive intervals since the day of the greatest inauguration fiasco.

Naturally the National capital is in its gala attire, and everything incidental to the great event is being done.

Under the circumstances, it is not surprising that the city has been adorned, they are perfectly right.

The reception given to Mr. Cleveland on his arrival last night amounted to a popular demonstration, and his warm welcome was everywhere.

Among the callers last evening was William H. Clark, Senator-elect, who came over from the Ebbitt House, and the greetings between the two were cordial.

Flower and his staff, who arrived at midnight, are also at the Arlington.

The governor was accompanied by about sixty members of Troop A, under Capt. Rowe, as an escort, and about twenty-five more men of the company are expected to arrive during the day.
