FIRE IN MID-OCEAN. Steamship Venango's Narrow Escape from Destruction.

Prompt Work by Captain and Crew Aids Saved Their Lives.

The British steamship Venango, which arrived from Hamburg last night, had a narrow escape from total destruction by fire during the voyage to this port.

Capt. Wilson reports that on the first night, in mid-ocean, at 10.30 P. M., during a strong northwesterly gale and high sea, a hanging lamp in the saloon broke from its fastenings...

The whole cabin became immediately one mass of flames.

Capt. Wilson, who was asleep in his room, forward of the saloon, was awakened by the intense heat and smoke, and with great difficulty reached the deck and raised an alarm.

All hands rushed to the headway where the fire had gathered, caused by the high wind, succeeded with the aid of a fire pump in subduing the flames.

This was not accomplished, however, before the interior of the cabin was completely charred and destroyed.

Capt. Wilson loses all his effects; cabin furniture and fixtures completely ruined.

The chief steward was severely burned about the face and body, but his wounds would have been undoubtedly destroyed had the fire had gained more headway before being discovered...

The loss will reach several thousand dollars.
