

LOS ANGELES, Cal., April 23.—The jury in the case of Henry Bertie, charged with killing his wife, Mrs. Nordholt-Bentley, by administering strychnine, returned a verdict of guilty of murder in the first degree yesterday and fixed his punishment at imprisonment for life.
