

PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH WORK.
Encouraging Committee Reports to the General Assembly.
With a Fling at the Chinese Law and World's Fair Saleons.

WASHINGTON, May 19.—Having got its first important piece of work out of the way yesterday by electing to the Moderatorship the Rev. Dr. W. G. Craig, of the Chicago McCormick University, the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church was ready to-day to hear reports from its various committees.

The report of the Permanent Committee on Temperance, as made public, enters into that subject largely in detail and makes some recommendations that will come before the Assembly. Referring to the impartial commission of inquiry concerning the liquor traffic is favored.

Local option is not regarded as the best and ultimate solution of the liquor problem, but the most of the Presbyterians here favored it as a stepping stone towards general prohibition.

The report of the Board of Church Extension Fund, which during the year there were 239 applications for assistance, upon which grants were made aggregating \$1,000,000.

The report of the Board of Foreign Missions displays a very satisfactory condition of affairs during the year.

The report of the Board of Education shows that the demand for ministers is ahead of the supply.
