Repeal Bill Probably to Be Presented To-Day. Silver Men Want a Stronger Section on Bimetallism. Rumor that Cleveland is Soon to Return to Washington.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18.—Interest in the proceedings in Congress to-day centers about the Senate. The Finance Committee of that body held a meeting at 10:30 this morning...

There is a little backwardness about coming to this test on the part of the free silver men as the bill now stands. Should they be beaten and the bill taken up for discussion, it will place them as a minority in the position of obstructionists...

There is an unconfirmed rumor here that President Cleveland will return to Washington within a week. It begins to appear that both sides in the House now regret that so long a period of time as two weeks was set apart for debate on the Silver Repeal bill...

There have been some curious features of the debate. One of the veteran official reporters remarked yesterday that in his long experience he had never before known a Congress wherein so many new members had expressed their views, and especially upon a question of such importance as in the present one.

"This discussion," he continued, "is peculiar also for the fact that almost every speech has been practically extemporaneous. We have had but one manuscript of any length so far which we could use in the Record, that of Mr. Morse, of Massachusetts. Mr. Brown, of Indiana, who briefly explained his views, also read from manuscript, but everybody else we had to report and write out in full.

"Several of the speakers had prepared manuscript, notably Messrs. Coombs, of New York, and Snodgrass and Patterson, of Tennessee, but they departed in their remarks so radically from the text that the copy was useless for our purpose and had to be written out in full.

"The Apportionment bill, which was introduced by Mr. Bryan, was also a subject of discussion. Mr. Bryan wrote out his speech and had it put in type, and the proof-sheets were on his desk, but after getting a speech almost wholly useless, even as a basis for a report, for, whereas he had prepared to talk an hour, he occupied almost three hours. Except the peroration, the effort was entirely a new speech, put into shape as he proceeded under the inspiration of the moment and the surroundings.
