LADY VIOLET WINS

The Blemton Stable's Filly Gets the Handicap To-Day Well in Hand.

MADRID ALSO A WINNER.

She Gets the Second Race, Miss Gallop the Third—Jockey Reiff Hurt.

GOSSIP OF THE TURF.

A peculiar and almost unprecedented incident occurred at both the Monmouth and Clifton tracks yesterday. Each was freely discussed by race-goers on their homeward journey last night.

RACE TRACK, MONMOUTH PARK, Aug. 18.—Although the programme was a poor one and offered no special features, the crowd that journeyed out to the track to see the horses run and incidentally to back them, was fully up to the average.

The weather was very warm. The horses freely perspired and did not need much preliminary exercise to bring them up and upon the pores of their skins.

The track was in excellent condition, and the time made in the different races almost touched the record mark.

The racing started off with a five-furlong dash. Some fine pointers were left after Stomenel, Hugh Poney, Quiver and Walcott were withdrawn. Lady Violet and Correction received heavy support in the betting and both horses went to the post even favorites, at 2 to 1.

There was a long delay at the post and a number of breakaways. This helped to kill the chance of the heavy-weighted Correction, and she gave up the struggle after the first three furlongs and finished third. Lady Violet ran under a strong pull all the way and won with ease by two lengths from Sirocco.

An accident happened in the second race, but fortunately it was not seriously hurt. Colonel S., with Reiff on his back, went through the temporary fence that is placed across the course, opposite the judges' stand.

The horse was running second at the time, but was driving badly. When Reiff hit him with the whip, the horse ran close to the rail and the railing gave away and horse and rider were soon mixed up with a pile of lumber.

After a delay of twelve minutes at the post, the flag fell to a fair start. Correction and Lady Violet went to the front in the first stride, and in the course company for half the distance, Lady Violet then drew out, and leading to the end, won easily by three lengths from Sirocco in a drive beating Correction a length for the time, 1:30.30.

THE WINNERS AT CLIFTON.

Robin Hood Gets the Second Race by Six Lengths.

Jim Clare Handles the Flag To-Day on Account of French's Injury.

RACE TRACK, CLIFTON, Aug. 18.—A very good crowd attended the races here to-day and saw a splendid car race off. The fields were all large and the quality was such that it insured the best kind of sport.

The track was still sticky, and although the hot sun had seemingly dried it out to great extent it was soft and holding underneath.

The weather was perfect for the sport, a nice breeze blowing across from Peckness Hills.

The fourth on the card, a four and a half furlong dash, was the feature of the programme, having among its starters such good sprinters as Grey Eagle, Fleurette, Key West, Zinkara and Triangle. The speculation on this race was very heavy and a good contest resulted.

Starter French received some bad injuries last evening by being thrown out of a buggy.

INCITED TO PILLAGE.

Emma Goldman Harangues a Meeting of the Unemployed.

Tells Them Shops Are Open and to Help Themselves.

Men Arrived for Yesterday's Riots Fined in Police Court.

A mixed gathering of trades unionists, who are connected with the Emma Goldman and John Most factions of the Anarchistic party, was held at Golden Rule Hall, 15 Livingston street, this afternoon.

The meeting was addressed by Emma Goldman, the alleged wife of Anarchist Bergman, who shot Supt. Frick, of the Chicago police, during the labor troubles at Homestead.

The gist of her speech was in accord with her radical views and those of the extremist wing of the Anarchists. "If you are hungry and need bread," she said, "go and get it."

"The shops are plentiful, and the doors are open." Her counsel to the already incensed unemployed laborers was calculated to incite them to the extreme methods of pillage and rapine.

She denounced the prevailing conditions of society as being responsible for the hardships which the unemployed are now facing.

Miss Goldman made only a mild allusion to her dynamite policy, but declared that it might be necessary in the very near future to resort to such methods.

A committee was appointed to rent a larger hall or meeting place on the east side, and to report as soon as possible upon the advisability of holding a parade of unemployed laborers in the districts of New York populated principally by the wealthy classes.

Another committee was appointed to report upon the most feasible plan for securing bread for the hungry unemployed.

At an earlier meeting of Reds, held in the same place, the principal speaker was one Blank, an Anarchist of the same stripe as Emma Goldman.

He denounced the New York press in violent terms for opposing the projected meeting of the so-called unemployed laborers in Union Square to-morrow night, for which 10,000 circulars have been issued and scattered broadcast through the downtown districts.

The Committee on Hallis secured the Tammany Assembly Room at 131 Allen street, there were about 200 men, all told, in the hall when the adjourned meeting was called to order.

Emma Goldman was nowhere in sight, but one of the first speakers announced that the fiery female Anarchist would surely address the meeting.

Then one after another men stood up and addressed the meeting, for the most part in "jargon," though there were two German speakers.

The speakers were very moderate, although one speaker resorted in eloquent style to pathetic scenes he had witnessed in the homes of the unemployed, where the children cried for food.

There was no enthusiasm. It was a tame affair.
