Two Men Who Beat the Officer Arraigned in Court To-Day.

The two men who brutally assaulted Patrolman Patrick J. Muldoon, of the East Fifty-first street station, on Aug. 21, were held for trial by Justice Burke, in the Yorkville Court to-day.

The men are James Lauff, aged twenty-two, of 225 East Forty-fifth street, and Thomas Scully, aged twenty-one, of 21 East Forty-fifth street. They were both employed as cart drivers by the street cleaning department.

Muldoon was arrested Lauff for disorderly conduct at East Forty-seventh street, between First Avenue and the river. Scully threw a cobblestone at the officer and hit him on the head.
