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
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EXTRA. A REBEL ULTIMATUM.

Bio Must Surrender or Be Relentlessly Bombarded. Mello's Message Causes a Panic in Brazil's Capital.

Merchants and Others Gathering Their Valuables for Flight. LONDON, Sept. 20--A despatch received to-day by a mercantile firm in this city states that Admiral Mello, commanding the rebel Brazilian fleet, has sent an ultimatum to the authorities in Rio Janeiro declaring that unless the city surrenders at once he will renew the bombardment relentlessly and with all the strength at his command.
