SLIGHT RALLY IN STOCKS.

At the Opening the Market Was Very Feverish.

Small Short Holders Frightened Into Covering.
The Wall street markets for securities continue feverish and unsettled. The rallies that occur are the result of purchases to cover short contracts, but whenever prices move up the bears renew their attacks and succeed in forcing out more or less long stock.

The Eastern and Western trunk line shares are most susceptible to bearish influence, because of the heavy falling-off in earnings. Fact which has been emphasized by the order given out by the Pennsylvania to reduce the working force of the road materially.

The rumors about a new issue of securities by the New York Central hurt the Central stocks, and the weakness among the weakest on the list this morning. There is some support in these and other leading shares is still noticeable.

Lake Shore fell 3 to 121; General Electric, 1-34 to 33-34; New England, 7-8 to 21-14; American Cotton Oil, 1-14 to 28-18; Chicago Gas, 7-8 to 61-8; St. Paul, 1 to 20-14; Rock Island, 1-8 to 62-34; New York Central, 5-8 to 36-12; In the specialties, Union Pacific declined 1-8 to 162, and New York Susquehanna & Western preferred, 1-34 to 44.
