He is a lieutenant of junior grade and was attached to the Kearsarge as a watch officer.

He testified that he had given orders to the man on the lookout to keep a bright watch. He thought the breakers could not have been seen more than 30 yards from the reef...

He said he had already given the order "Hard to port" before Capt. Heyerman instructed him to do so.

Where the yards braced up enough to allow the engines in backing, asked Admiral Gherardi.

They were not, said the witness.

"Why were the yards not braced up?" asked Capt. Heyerman.

"Because the winds were almost dead aft."

THE SUNDAY SALOON BILL.

Through It Liquor Dealers Hope to Reduce the Power of Police.

(By Associated Press.)

ALBANY, March 1.—There has been much speculation as to the bill introduced in the Assembly proposing to submit at the coming November election, to a vote of the people of New York City the question whether or not saloons and liquor stores may sell on Sunday after 1 o'clock.

The second section provides that if the vote is favorable to Sunday selling, the next session of the Legislature may amend the Excise laws accordingly and place around Sunday selling proper conditions and restrictions.

"The measure," said Assemblyman Folger today, "is the result of the Wholesale Liquor Dealers' Association, which is calculated to reduce the power of the police over the saloon trade. This is the political side of it, and in its passage the wholesale liquor dealers propose to show as they never intend to do so."

The Republicans hope to split the vote of the liquor dealers.
