MRS. ARNOLD A CATHOLIC. Father Adams's and Father Johnson's Wealthy Ritualistic Patron Enters the Mother Fold.


CHURCH OF THE REDEEMER MOURNS. This Victory, Too, Is Father Van Rensselaer's—Her Old Parish Loses Prestige and Financial Aid.



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
