

FINE DRESSES SEIZED

An unusually bold attempt at smuggling has just been brought to light by Customs Inspectors Maher and Mahoney.

Along with a lot of baggage taken out of the Cunard liner Umbria last Sunday morning was a dilapidated looking trunk and satchel. The trunk bore only two marks on the outside. One indicated that it was shipped by the second cabin, the other that it was longed ostensibly, at least, to somebody whose name commenced with a "T."

The satchel had no marks whatever. Just as these pieces of baggage were about to be carried from the dock, together with some other baggage labeled "T," the inspector noticed that the trunk was not being taken to the steamer.

The wagon was stopped and the driver questioned. A gentleman thereupon told the inspectors that the unlabeled baggage had gotten mixed up with his own inadvertently.

He disclaimed ownership of them, and they were accordingly removed from the wagon and taken to the steamer-room in the Harco office. Mr. Hickey, chief of the Seizure Department, thereupon opened the trunk and valise and brought out of them the most elaborately gorgeous dresses and suits in his life, together with hundreds of yards of laces, trimmings and fin linings.

A BURGLARS' GRAFT.

Horwitz's Fur House Looted Twice Within Two Weeks.

Only One Block from the Mercer Street Police Station.

Ludwig Horwitz, a manufacturer of furs at 270 Mercer street, reported to Inspector McLaughlin today that his place was robbed last night of a quantity of mink and other valuable furs.

The building where the robbery occurred is a two-story brick structure on a block below Capt. Bakins's Mercer street police station, on the opposite side of the street.

The whole of the upper floor is occupied by Mr. Horwitz. Entrance is obtained by a stairway leading to the second floor on the south side of the building. There are three doors, one leading to the office in front, another into the storeroom and the other into the manufacturing department.

All of the doors except that opening into the office were secured by patent locks and bolted from the inside. The robbers seem to have been acquainted with this fact and attacked the office door, which they pried open with a jimmy.

The windows between the storeroom and manufacturing department were then pried open and the place was ransacked.
