

DEER POICE WORK.

Detectives Arrested and Counterfeiters Allowed to Escape.

Secret Service Men Locked Up for Five Hours in Hoboken.

After Their Release They Caught Three of the Counterfeiters.

James L. Stillman, Fred Burke and George Holmes were arrested for counterfeiting at 313 West Seventeenth street last night, by United States Secret Service Officers Thomas Callaghan and Frank Esquirel...

Chief Callaghan was very indignant over his treatment at the hands of the Hoboken police.

Chief Callaghan's story, he said, was that Patrick Hayes over there, he said, "who is the smartest man on earth, and some of his men are about as bad as any I ever seen. If it hadn't been for their interference we would probably have captured all the counterfeiters of the morning."

Esquirel had succeeded in locating the gang's headquarters.

Last Tuesday afternoon the detectives showed the crowd in Fourteenth street, near Broadway. They followed them to the morning, and arrived in Hoboken, the men immediately went to work passing bad coins, principally half dollars.

Callaghan obtained one of the counterfeiters, and was about to arrest them when a man on the shoulder said he wanted them. They tried to explain that they were not counterfeiters, but that the counterfeiters were on the boat.

Callaghan, at the station, would not regard them as dangerous characters. They were taken to the secret service office and released.

They informed him to telegraph their chief in his office, and the officers had been in a cell for five hours, from 11 in the evening until 4 in the morning.

They were released, and Callaghan and Esquirel were released at 2:30 o'clock.

The arrest of the secret-service men was made on the complaint of August Koster, a cigar-dealer, at 208 Washington street, who pointed them out to the policeman as they were about to board the ferry-boat after the counterfeiters.

Koster said that Esquirel a short time before he started his store and bought cigarettes, giving a half-dollar in payment. Koster gave him 40 cents change, which he noticed the man had entered, and asked to see the coin the man had paid for cigarettes.

Callaghan pocketed the coin and hurried away. Koster saw him John Esquirel, who had given him the coin, and jumped to the conclusion that he was the victim of a "flim-flam" game.

The defense of the police is Koster's story. They say that it is undoubtedly one of the counterfeiters who bears a slight resemblance to the secret service officer.

HAS TWO NEW WITNESSES.

Mr. McIntyre Expects Strong Evidence Against Dr. Meyer.

The Prisoner's Wife in Court and Avoids Meeting His Gaze.

After three weeks spent in securing a jury, the second trial of Dr. Henry Meyer began to-day in Part II. of the Court of General Sessions.

The prisoner was brought to court by Deputy Sheriff Dalympic, at 10:30. He at once entered into earnest conversation with his wife's sister, who handed him a picture of his infant, which was born to his wife in the House of Detention some months ago.

Mrs. Meyer, who has been denied at the House of Detention as a witness since before Meyer's first trial, entered the court-room soon after her husband.

She stood within the inclosure occupied by the officials of the court, and looked up at the witness as the latter stood stoically avoiding casting her glances towards the prisoner and the fact that she intended to turn State's evidence and become an informer against her husband.

Assistant District-Attorney McIntyre, who will conduct the case for the people, said his opening address would consist of two parts. He had two new witnesses, Joseph Kroeger and one Atkins, from the State's evidence, who were expected to give incriminating testimony.

It is understood that they will testify that Meyer tried to induce them to cooperate with him in his alleged murderous schemes to obtain the pardon of the prisoners in the State Prison.

Stringent measures were enforced against the witnesses and those with friends at court could get into the judicial chamber.

Recorder Smyth took his seat at 11:30, and a few minutes later the joint-plaintiff, Dr. Henry Meyer, appeared.
