

HUNGRY PARK POLICE

Want to Share the Fruits of the Increase of Salary Bill.

Claim That They Rank the Same as the Regular Patrolmen,

If They Win a Test Case the City Will Lose \$50,000 Yearly.

The park policemen believe that under the Police Increase of Salary bill recently passed by the Legislature they are entitled to the same increase in salaries as the members of the metropolitan force, and they are accordingly discussing methods of having the provision of the bill defined.

It is probable that a suit will be brought to settle the matter, and in order that it may be thoroughly pushed it is proposed to raise a fund to engage Joseph Choate and R. G. Ingersoll as counsel.

One section of the law provides that: On and after the first day of January, 1895, the grade and the pay of compensation of members of the police force who are patrolmen in all cities of this State having a population of more than 100,000, shall be as follows:

Among such members who are patrolmen on said first day of January, 1895, and who shall have served five years or upwards on said force, shall be members of the first grade; all such members shall have served on such force for at least one year and more than three years shall be members of the second grade; all such members who shall have served on such force for less than three years and more than two years shall be members of the third grade; all other members who are patrolmen on said force who shall have served less than two years and more than one year shall be members of the fourth grade; and all persons appointed patrolmen on or after the first day of January, 1895, shall, on their appointment, become members of the fifth grade.

Continuing, the amended act provides that the salaries of policemen in the first grade shall be not less than \$1,400 a year; in the second grade, \$1,300; third grade, \$1,200; fourth grade, \$1,100; and the fifth grade \$1,000.

It was, of course, the intention of the Legislature to increase the salaries of policemen of the metropolitan force only, but the men who wear the gray uniforms believe they have caught the legislators napping, and some of them, it is stated, propose to have the matter settled in the courts.

Among city officials it is commonly understood that park policemen are technically park keepers, and that they are termed policemen as a matter of courtesy only. They appear on the city salary roll as park keepers, but when one of the latter was asked to-day if that was his official position, he said no. "The act creating the force," he said, "used the designation patrolmen, and the term park keeper is incorrect. I believe we will profit by the error of the legislators."

"Several lawyers," he continued, "have volunteered the same opinion, but no attorney has been retained, nor has any money been raised to do so. There is talk, however, of collecting a fund to test the act, but so far nothing definite has been done."

Should the park policemen win their point, the salaries of the patrolmen in such grade will be increased \$200 each, which would cost the city over \$50,000 annually.

Corporation Counsel Clark, when asked about the matter, said he was not ready to give an opinion. He said he had not yet seen the act as signed by the Governor, and could not, therefore, discuss such an important feature.
