IT LOOKS LIKE A FORGERY. A Justice Declares Nolte's Act Suspicious. His Brother's Widow Almost Defrauded of \$2,000.

What Justice Patterson, of the Supreme Court, thought to be a flagrant case of forgery came to light in a suit before him to-day in Part IV. of the Supreme Court.

For some time preceding his death he had been confined to his bed, and had not been able to attend to business.

After her husband's death, Mrs. Nolte called upon his brothers to get the certificate of membership of her husband in the Ancient Order of United Workmen.

She put the case in the hands of Law- yer Grossman, of Grossman & Vorhaus, of the Pullitzer Building, who found that the Ancient Order of United Workmen had no record of such a membership.

After hearing the testimony, Justice Patterson said: "This seems to be one of the most flagrant cases of forgery that has ever come to my notice, and I think it should at once be laid before the Grand Jury."

Mrs. Nolte has also sued her brothers-in-law for her husband's interest in the estate of her late husband, and is awaiting the decision of Justice Cullen on her application to be appointed guardian of the property of her late husband.

LOCKED THE WAGON MAN UP. Policeman Malone Lectured for Causing Innocence to Suffer.
