WASHINGTON, June 23.—The half-hour usually devoted to miscellaneous business in the Senate was today occupied by Mr. Call (Dem., Fla.) with a resolution providing for a committee of five Senators to investigate the election and control of Senators and Representatives by corporations. He made a brief speech on the subject.
