

BROOKLYN. THE LEGISLATURE CRITICISED.

Justice Gaynor Says a Law Plainly Shows the "Prentice Hand."

Justice Gaynor, of the Supreme Court, Brooklyn, this morning handed down a decision denying the petition of Peter Lyman for reinstatement as assistant bookkeeper of the Hall of Records.
