LAST EDITION. A BREAK AT PULLMAN.

Return to Work of 150 Hollanders on the Tracks. Attempt to Wreck a Wisconsin Central Train in Chicago.

Guerrilla Warfare on the Northern Pacific in the Northwest.

CHICAGO, July 18.—The first break in the ranks of the Pullman strikers has occurred. 150 Hollanders having gone back to work on the tracks back of the Pullman foundry.

The men quit work when the strike was first declared. No effort was made by the other strikers to prevent the men going to work.

Four strikers threw a switch in front of a Wisconsin Central passenger train, late last night, and derailed the engine, baggage-car and two coaches.

The train was moving slowly and nobody was injured. One of the men was arrested.

TACOMA, Wash., July 18.—Three hundred and fifty-one new employees have been put to work on the Pacific Division of the Northern Pacific since the strike began.

Practically all the old engineers have returned to work. Many of the switchmen, conductors, freight clerks and some of the firemen who quit have applied for their positions, but not all could be taken back, as new men had been engaged.

The road would be in operation as usual from end to end, the officers say, but for the guerrilla warfare on the Pacific coast. The force of deputy marshals in this State has been reduced from 200 to 200. All bridges are being guarded by regulars.

BUTTE, Mont., July 18.—Attorneys of the Union Pacific and Northern Pacific roads here state that the city as soon as a sufficient force of regular troops arrive. Butte contains fully 5,000 members of different labor organizations all of whom sympathize with the strikers.

Several bridges between this city and Lima were burned yesterday and one was blown up with dynamite. President Debs has been arrested.

MORE TROOPS FOR OSWEGO. Forty-first Separate Company, of Syracuse, Expected To-Day.

OSWEGO, N. Y., July 18.—Rioting longshoremen last night entered the houses of James Sextsmith and Isaac Tenmore, non-union men, and brutally assaulted them. Sextsmith's wife came to her husband's assistance and was also beaten.

The longshoremen then visited other non-union houses and threw stones through the windows and threatened to hang the men if they should not leave the houses.

The militia are now occupying the houses surrounding the longshoremen from within 300 feet of the non-union houses.

The Forty-first Separate Company, of Syracuse, is expected here soon to all the Oswego militia in preserving the peace.

MEN DRIVEN FROM ENID. Situation Growing Worse There and at Round Pond.

ENID, Okla., July 18.—Telegrams from Enid to Acting Gov. Lowe state that affairs in Enid and Round Pond are hourly getting worse. The track has again been blown up in several places. The handful of soldiers there is powerless and laughed at. Certain men, it is reported, were chained out of town with Winchester, and a killing would have occurred had it not been for cool heads of several citizens, who advised moderation.

A number of military marshals were sent to the scene of trouble by Marshal S. H. H. yesterday. All passenger and freight traffic is suspended. The violence is all caused by secret organizations.

Refused to Use Safety Lamps. WILKESBARRE, Pa., July 18.—About seventy miners employed in the number 4 slope of the Kingston coal company at Wilkesbarre struck yesterday because of prohibiting the use of the ordinary mine lamp in the slope.

Lamps to be substituted. The miners object to the use of the new lamp because of the danger of fire. The small light of the safety lamp could not send out a flash without warning. Their offer was refused.

Working Under Militia Guard. HEMPSTEAD, Mich., July 18.—Nearly 500 miners and surface employees worked yesterday at three of the six mines, protected by 400 militiamen. The prospect is that the number will be 1,000 today, and the power of the strike will be broken.

DEBS STILL IN JAIL. RAID IN CHINATOWN. LED A DOUBLE LIFE.

A. R. U. Officers Enjoying Their Respite from Work. Forty Policemen Swoop Down Upon Celestial Opium-Sellers.

Debs' Case Compared to Master Workman Quinn's in New York. More than \$1,000 Worth of the Drug Confiscated.

CHICAGO, July 18.—Debs seems to enjoy jail life, and so do George W. Howard, Vice-President; Sylvester Kolher, Secretary, and T. W. Rogers, a director of the A. R. U. All of them were smiling and in the best of spirits to-day after their first night's experience in the Cook County Jail.

A large party of the personal friends of the imprisoned strike leaders came early to the county jail, but the daily corridor scrubbing was in progress, and no one was admitted for some time. President Debs sent word down to the waiting visitors that himself and friends had enjoyed a good night's rest, and had nothing to say that would interest the public.

Before 11 A. M., Debs came down from his cell to meet his stenographer, who had arrived with a bundle of mail for him. The president was in good humor. "I had the best night's sleep I had in a month or two," said he. "Nothing disturbed me, not even the ghost of that man who was hanged the other day, and whose spirit is said to be roaming about in here. I have absolutely nothing to add to what I have already said, concerning our arrest. We are here and will stay here until next Monday, at least."

President Debs then fell to looking over his big batch of mail matter. Vice-President Kolher came down from his cell in the debtors' department, and said: "We are still enjoying this respite from work."

Considerable conflict of opinion seems to prevail among lawyers concerning the justice of Debs' commitment for contempt, many maintaining that the law is unwarrantably applied at the present stage of the case. Assistant District Attorney Henry W.
