EXTRA. STEPHENSON DISMISSED. Police Commissioners Find Him Guilty of Accepting Bribes. THEIR DECISION UNANIMOUS. Youngest Police Captain Joins the Ranks of Cross, Devery and Doherty. DEVERY GIVES UP HIS SHIELD. But His Counsel Writes that It is Not to Be Construed as a Waiver of His Rights.

Capt. John Thomas Stephenson, of the Mulberry street station, was found guilty by the Police Commissioners at 2.30 this afternoon of the charge of extorting hood money from commission merchants for "sidewalk privileges" while he was in command of the Leonard street station and for neglect of duty in failing to enforce the sidewalk ordinance against the merchants who paid the hood money.

All the Commissioners voted aye to the verdict of "guilty as charged," and assented to the dismissal of Capt. Stephenson from the department.



EX-POLICE CAPT JOHN T. STEPHENSON. The evidence in Capt. Stephenson's trial went to show that Ordinance Man James Kelly collected \$25 a year from the owners of stores in the middle of blocks and \$50 a year from corner storekeepers for the privilege of occupying the sidewalk in violation of the ordinance; that Kelly did it in the name of the captain, and with the captain's assent and connivance.

The captain's dismissal was agreed upon in executive session, and the formal verdict and dismissal was done in open meeting, held at 2 1/2 o'clock, and came in the regular order of business. Immediately following the dismissal of Stephenson, the board of police captains for an aggregate of about \$2,000 for expenses in securing evidence against disorderly houses were submitted to Kelly, with stating that he had no fund from which to pay the bills.
