HEL UP A STREET CAR.

Passengers Plundered by a Gang of Toughs on Eighth Avenue.

NO POLICEMAN WAS IN SIGHT.

Pedestrians Also Compelled to Stand and Deliver Up Valuables.

IT WAS A REIGN OF ROUGHS.

Only Two Arrests Made After the Roughts Had Beaten Many People.

A gang of white and colored toughs, who have recently made life miserable for the dwellers in upper Hudson street, and the vicinity, capped the climax of their depredations last night when they held up an Eighth Avenue horse car and "went through" the passengers in Western style.

The crowd of thieves, numbering ten or twelve, had marched down Hudson street from Thirteenth. Twice they had shouted "Fire" and "Police" in the hope of attracting a crowd, but Ninth Ward residents have grown careful to the last two months, and scarcely any one paid heed to the calls.

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The police of the Ninth Precinct are seeking for the names and addresses of the passengers who were taken to Jefferson Market Court and robbed.
