The Broadway Stakes over the Titan course is the feature of the programme offered at Jerome Park to-day. Hugh Penny, Discount, Halton and Live Oak are also named to go, but they are hardly capable of beating the Dwyer candidate, who has been treated very liberally by the conditions of the race.

A good lot of youngsters will meet in the second, and they should furnish good betting. The fourth race is for beaten horses and has four starters. A big field of fairly good sprinters is named to start in the fifth race.
