"The LXX will now probably accept the suggestion that Strong be nominated," said a member this morning, "and it is very likely that the Grace people will then go ahead and nominate a ticket of their own."

"We expect to go into the conference of the anti-Tammany organizations this afternoon," said Chairman W. M. K. O'Leary, of the Republican Conference Committee.

Before entering the committee-room Charles S. Smith said that, as it looks now, Goff is out of the question for the mayoralty nomination.

He said, however, that he still had hopes of the anti-Tammany organizations coming together. Gen. Horace Porter expressed similar views.

WOMEN TO FIGHT TAMMANY. They Form an Organization in the Twenty-third District.

About two hundred women of the Twenty-third Assembly District met last night in Elmwood Hall, 734 Amsterdam avenue, to organize a Women's Anti-Tammany Association.

The meeting was the result of a call issued by James O'Brien and Mark M. Pomeroy, of the anti-Tammany Democracy. The woman's organization is being organized as an auxiliary of their body.

The meeting was called to order by Col. J. J. Gifford, Chairman of the Anti-Tammany Democracy, who made a speech setting forth the object of their organization.

At the conclusion of Col. Gifford's speech, Mrs. M. M. Kelly was elected Chairman and Miss Ella Howls, Secretary. Mrs. Pomeroy made a speech in the course of which she said:

"We come not as Democrats, not as Republicans, but as women, with the sincere desire of removing from this city and State the curse, the scandal and the disgrace that have come through a combination of men who have forgotten their duty to their country and their fellow citizens, in order to hold place as directing members of Tammany Hall."

Miss Kelly, in her address to the women's club, also made a speech in favor of women working for the overthrow of Tammany Hall.

Mrs. Emma Beckwith followed. She referred to the result of the recent campaign in Kentucky. Princess Vortia, an Indian widow, who has been the center of the city in the slums of the lower east side.

About fifty of the women present enrolled their names as members of the Association, and the meeting adjourned, to meet next Tuesday evening at the residence of Mrs. Pomeroy, 50 West Ninety-sixth street.
