

GEN. BOOTH COMING.

The Commen or of the Salvation Army Will Arrive To-Night.

Monday Will Open a Great Hallelujah Week for His Forces.

Parades, Councils, Lectures and Banquets on the Programme.

After an absence of seven years, Gen. William Booth is coming from England to superintend a series of grand manoeuvres and make a National tour of inspection through the American camps of his command, the Salvation Army.

His public appearances will be attended with the characteristic demonstrations of the Army in full force. The programme covers the whole of next week and consists of daily parades, outdoor meetings, indoor meetings, bands, banners, hymns, shouts, marching hosts, tambos, brass drums, trombones and a grand hallelujah time generally.

The general will find in America a country under the standard of 90,000 troops armed and equipped for every emergency, which is a greater element than that of the United States Army. He will find in the city a system of barracks in almost every ward, a large uniformed force of several hundred and a spirit of support in the hearts of many wealthy people who contribute to the fund, by his own appearance in the army's movements.
