SHOT AT BURGLARS.

Flunky Mrs. Crocheron Prevented
A Robbery in Her House.

The Visitors Had Intended to Chloro-
form the Inmates.

They Escaped by a Window and No
Trace of Them Can Be Found.

(Special to The Evening World.)
BUTTERFORD, N. J., Oct. 30.—After
trying to chloroform members of the
household, thieves were frightened away
last night by Mrs. Edmund F. Crocheron,
who lives in a handsome house at
Hess Avenue and Elliott place.
Mrs. Crocheron is a plucky little woman,
whose husband, a traveler for a
New York house, is away from home a
large part of the time.
Mrs. Crocheron started on a trip yesterday,
and his wife was left in the
house with her children and a female
friend. About 10:30 o'clock thieves entered
the cellar, but could not get up
into the house.
Climbing to the second story, they
saw a window and entered a room
where some members of the family
were asleep.
The noise awoke Mrs. Crocheron, who
stepped in an adjoining room. She grasped
her revolver, and, without hesitation,
opened the door, while the robbers,
hearing her, had just escaped.
When the door was opened she was
almost overpowered by the odor of chloro-
form, which had been lavishly distributed
about the room. Reaching the window
she fired five shots at the retreating
forms of two men, which brought As-
sistant Marshal James Talbot to the
house. No trace of the thieves was
found.
The occupants of the room had not
been affected by the drug, and on being
ambushed by the shots took refuge in
another room.

WINGED A FLEEING BURGLAR.
Policeman Tucker Shot Meyer, Who
Had Stolen Silverware.

(Special to The Evening World.)
ELIZABETH, N. J., Oct. 30.—John
Meyer, a burglar, was shot in the ankle
last night at 4:30 o'clock this morning by
Policeman Ben Tucker, while trying to
escape, and is now in the City Hospital.
Meyer dropped a bundle in his flight
which contained about \$200 worth of
silverware and two valuable fur coats.
The place entered by the thief was ex-
-comptroller Henry Allen's, on Railway
avenue. The family this morning dis-
covered that the house had been broken
into and ransacked and part of the
silverware taken.
The robber was first seen by Policeman
Dunn at 1:30 o'clock this morning.
He tried to stop him on Morris avenue,
but the man fled and in the darkness
managed to elude the policeman. This
was when he threw away the stolen
property.

He was next seen by Policeman Tucker,
who is an expert marksman and is
armed with a bullet after him, and he
and Newark, towards which city the
thief was heading.
He started on a run when Tucker
called on him to stop, and a long chase
ensued. Finding the fugitive was gain-
ing on him, Tucker drew his revolver and
fired a bullet after him, which, it is
believed, was the one which caused
his fall. The thief was then taken to
the hospital.

When the policeman reached his side
an ambulance was called and he was re-
moved to the hospital. The wound will
probably keep him for the rest of his life.
Mr. Allen called at Police Head-
quarters at 10 o'clock today and identi-
fied his property. All the articles mis-
taken were recovered.
Meyer is thirty-eight years old, belongs
to Jersey City and boarded with John
Johnson at 43 Broadway avenue.
It is believed by the police to be the
same man who has robbed many residences
in Jersey City, and whom the
police are endeavoring to locate.

EX-PREMIER MERCIER DEAD.

Leader of the Canadian Liberals
Passed Away This Morning.

Held Many High Offices and Was a
Hard Political Fighter.

(By Associated Press.)
MONTREAL, Oct. 30.—Ex-Premier
Mercier died at 9:10 o'clock this morning. He
had been hopelessly ill for weeks.

Honore Mercier was Prime Minister of
the Province of Quebec from 1887 to 1891,
when he and his Ministry were dismissed
by Lieut.-Gov. Angers, charges of pecu-
lation being made against Mercier, on
which a jury subsequently acquitted him.

M. Mercier was born in Itherville, Que-
bec, in 1809. He was the son of a farm-
er, was admitted to the Bar in 1830,
but entered politics by way of journal-
ism. He was a Liberal, a champion of
French Canadians, and a determined and
bitter fighter.

He was elected to the Dominion House
in 1872; withdrew from a triangular con-
test in 1874, to prevent a Tory's election;
was re-elected in 1879 on the occasion
of taking his first Cabinet position, that
of Solicitor-General in the Provincial
Government.

In oratory, M. Mercier was powerful
and convincing.
He was a Knight of the Grand Cross
of the Order of Gregory the Great, a
Comptroller of the Holy Roman Empire, and
an Officer of the Legion of Honor. He

KENTUCKY MIDGET DEAD.

Abner Astrop Kept a Store and
Never Exhibited Himself.

(By Associated Press.)
ASHLAND, Ky., Oct. 30.—Abner As-
trop, the midget, is dead in his mountain
home in Johnson County. He was fifty-
two years old. Astrop never weighed
more than forty-five pounds, and at his
death his weight was but thirty pounds.
He was 2 feet ten inches tall. Astrop
was born in Johnson County. He was
of ordinary size in babyhood, but he
grew very little after his fifth year. His
strength for a dwarf was remarkable.
His parents established him in a small
cross roads store when he was twenty
years old, and he spent his life in it.
Museum managers made flattering offers
to him, but he refused them. He died
worth \$10,000. He never married and
was never outside his native county.

Clerk Reed Installed.
James C. Reed, recently appointed Clerk of the
United States Circuit Court of Appeals, was in-
stalled in his new position today by United
States Circuit Judge Lacombe, Shipman and Wal-
lace. Mr. Reed takes the place of John A.
Bishop, Clerk of the United States District
Court and United States Commissioner. Mr. Bishop
was re-elected to the Court of Appeals
and a seat on the Supreme Court.
