YOKOHAMA, Nov. 15.—Despatches received here from the headquarters of the Japanese army operating against Port Arthur say that Field Marshal Oyama was expected to attack that place yesterday or to-day. The Chinese force defending Port Arthur is estimated to amount to 16,000 men of all arms.

HE SHAMMED INSANITY.

Creditors of an Indicted Allegheny Man Employ Experts.

(By Associated Press.) PITTSBURGH, Nov. 15.—F. Rind, a wealthy lumber dealer of Allegheny, who was declared insane a year ago, was yesterday declared sane by a jury on the testimony of two experts, Drs. Samuel Ayers and C. C. Whaley.

When Rind was pronounced insane by a Commission, he was under indictment for forgery.

It was claimed that he was not accountable for his doings. Since his incarceration a number of his creditors, believing him to be shamming, employed the experts to learn the truth.

Yesterday the evidence of the physicians was that he had been shamming and the jury reversed the former decree.

LARGEST IN THE WORLD.

Two Oil Wells That Yield a Total of 500 Barrels a Day.

(By Associated Press.) BRADNER, Nov. 15.—The Kirkbridge Bros. of Toledo, can claim the two largest oil wells in the world. Their Meyer No. 3, which was struck on Saturday last, is doing 100 barrels an hour, and yesterday their Jones No. 2, located four miles east of here, came in for 500 barrels an hour.

The tanks are wholly inadequate to take care of the output, and as a result, the ground around the well was covered with the oil to a depth of four feet.

The well is in territory which has been drilled repeatedly without yielding any more than ten barrels a well. As a result the local oil industry is greatly excited.

FIVE MEN BADLY SCALDED.

One Victim of an Explosion in Indiana Will Die.

The fish on their hands, faces, breasts and legs is cooked, and when Garner's clothes were removed the flesh dropped off in pieces. He cannot recover. The other men are suffering terribly, but will not die. The mill was slightly damaged.
