"The situation in Alabama, growing out of Kolb's threatened contest for the gubernatorial chair, is a very serious one and will materially affect all business interests of that State."

MOBILE, Ala., Nov. 30.—The Mobile companies of the First Regiment will leave tonight for Montgomery, to participate in the inauguration of Gov. Gates on Saturday. No one in Mobile shares in the belief that Kolb will make any effort towards assuming the Governorship of Alabama, and the soldier boys here will attend will do so out of compulsion to their Gov. Jones and the incoming Gov. Gates, the one-armed Confederate soldier, whom they delight to honor.
