

WHAT BURNS SAYS.

There is a Great Opportunity for Labor to Organize, He Thinks.

Brains and Not Money Needed for Perfect Success.

The English Leader Leaves for Denver To-Night.

John Burns and David Holmes, the English labor leaders, were so fatigued after their hard day's tramping around the city yesterday and the prolonged dinner at Clarendon Hall last night, that they were unable to attend the big Federation Convention on Dec. 5.

The party will leave the Grand Central Station at 7 o'clock, but while Messrs. Gompers and the other Federation officers and delegates go on straight to Denver, Mr. Burns and his English colleagues will stop off at Niagara.

"There is too much artificiality about New York," Mr. Burns said to an "Evening World" reporter. "I want to see something natural—to look at nature just as it is. Therefore we will all drop off to see the Falls and surrounding country. It will be refreshing."

The dinner tendered to the Englishmen last night by the trade and labor unions was not over until nearly 9 o'clock this morning, an occurrence for which they were not at all prepared.

"It was great," Mr. Burns said, "but I tasted an awful long time. As I said before, I fully appreciate the manner in which we were received here. When you consider that I have a number of pretty sharp things about certain conditions in this country, and that I cannot stay four or five months so that I could put it in."

When asked what he thought, after his many conferences with labor leaders here, of the condition of organized labor, Mr. Burns said: "If the condition of the working classes here is as much better than at home as they say it is, then there is a great opportunity for a powerful organization. I am sorry to see dissension. It must be remembered, however, that it is brains, not money, that makes a perfect organization. It must be directed by men who think."

My own opinion is that organizations must depend for their main strength not only here but all over the world, on the English-speaking people. That is the center of the world, and from the center everywhere."

The visiting labor leaders had no special plans for to-day. No places are to be visited. Instead they will all remain at their hotel, writing letters and attending to business details.

RETURNED LIKE ENOCH ARDEN

Supposed Dead Woman Turns Up Alive After Eight Years.

CHICAGO, Dec. 5.—Mrs. Percis Anna Hartig disappeared in Detroit eight years ago, and was thought to have been killed on the railroad tracks near that place.
