Tied by the Tail to a Coal Barge in Quarantine

A Hungry Shark Was Feeding on the Jaw.

PERRY WILL FIGHT HARD.

As told in "The Evening World" yesterday, Oliver Curtis Perry will not go back to the Asylum for Criminal Insane until the provisions of the extradition laws have been exhausted.

Shortly before noon Lawyer Simpson appeared before Judge Lippincott, in Jersey City, and the Judge granted an order, directing Sheriff John J. Tooley to show cause why Perry should not be discharged, on the ground that his commitment is defective. Weyer Simpson stated the commitment only alleges that Perry is a self-confessed escaped lunatic. This, he held, was not sufficient.

The order is returnable at 10 o'clock to-morrow morning. The prosecutor has been notified. It is thought when the case comes before Judge Lippincott to-morrow, he will order Perry recommitted and have the commitment made regular.

Perry is a hero with Jerseyites. Chief of Police Simon Kelly, of Weehawken, presented Perry with a new suit of clothes. Now he is well fed, well clothed and well groomed.

Perry still sits in the corridor on the ground floor near the warden's office. His cell is No. 2. He had for his companions to-day Murderers Paul Genz and Thomas McLaren, and was talking to reporters. The warden said he passed a comfortably night and his feet are getting better.

Mayor Kelly, of Weehawken, insists that the reward shall be paid to Policeman McAleneas, who captured Perry, before the latter is allowed to leave the State.

Getting Evidence into Shape.

LYONS, April 18.—The authorities at Matteawan Asylum have sent to the Wayne County Clerk for copies of the indictments on which Oliver Curtis Perry was tried and convicted. Deputy Sheriff Jerry Kelly has been asked for evidence in this case. This evidence is necessary in making out requisition papers.

Requisition Issued for Perry.

ALBANY, April 18.—Gov. Morton has issued a requisition on the Governor of New Jersey for the return to this State of Oliver Curtis Perry, the train robber, captured in that State.

DEATH WATCH FOR BUCHANAN

SING SING, N. Y., April 18.—Dr. Buchanan, the wife-murderer, now realizes that there is no longer any hope and that he must meet death in the electric chair next Monday. When he received the news last night that the United States Court at Washington had refused to interfere he told Warden Sage that he would try and meet his fate like a man.

Buchanan has sent for his counsel, Lawyer Gibbons, and for Herbert W. Knight, of Newark, N. J., who is a friend. Buchanan desires to confer with them as to applying to Gov. Morton for executive clemency, although he has little or no hope that the Governor will interfere.

Buchanan is occupying a new cell, having been changed by Warden Sage, who is taking every precaution to prevent him from injuring himself.

The keepers who will comprise the death watch until Monday are W. H. Cochran, Martin Dealey and John Garby. Warden Sage to-day sent out the invitations to the persons who will witness the execution. They are mostly physicians and newspaper reporters. Not more than thirty persons will be present.

State Electrician Davis is expected here this afternoon or to-morrow morning to test the electrical machine in the execution room.

Buchanan has not yet professed religion, but he is visited frequently by the Rev. Mr. Well, the Chaplain.

BEEF PULLS LEATHER UP, TOO.

With Higher Priced Meat Come More Expensive Shoes.

The Big Cattle Combine Whines About Alleged Losses.

Armour, the Chicago and New York millionaire beef magnate, almost weeps as he speaks of how the balance is on the wrong side of his big ledgers each day, because of the awful scarcity of cattle and the dreadfully high prices.

Dr. Salmon, Chief of the Bureau of Animal Industry in the Department of Agriculture at Washington, in a preliminary report to Secretary Morton on the results of his investigation, says, after giving figures showing extremes of prices for dressed beef cattle at Chicago:

These figures do not warrant any such sensational rise in the price of dressed beef to butchers by the great slaughtering establishments.

The slaughtering establishments are those of the Armour, the Swifts and their competitors. "It is plain," said a Washington Market meat cutter to-day, "that the Beef Trust is making enormous profits, and when Armour whines and whimpers, he is only adding insult to injury. The Trust practically controls the New York market, and has forced up prices until retail butchers must charge five to ten cents a pound more on some portions of the carcass. This has caused such falling off in trade as to lose money."

The 600 members of the meat side Kosher Butchers Association hope to secure a compromise from the United Dressed Beef Company by this evening.

The managers have been insolent to the Kosher butchers, because the latter are poor and must submit. But now that they have combined 600 strong they hope to bring about better conditions of affairs.

The increase for the price for cattle has advanced the price of leather nearly 15 per cent. during the last ten days, and in St. Louis, the great leather centre, wholesalers are advancing their prices to shoe manufacturers to two cents a foot for upper leather. Sole leather has advanced in six weeks more than 5 cents a pound, while uppers have gone up 4 cents a foot. Wholesale shoe dealers estimate that 15 per cent. advance is a moderate estimate of what is coming.

The Leather Belting Association, meeting at the Astor House, had the subject of the unprecedented advance in the price of hides for special consideration. Fishbein, Jewish president of the Association and Mayor Schieren, of Brooklyn, is one of the members. A general advance of 20 per cent. on the entire price list was agreed upon.

Clubs Didn't Pay for Their Beer. The Union Hill Brewery Company, of Newark, in the City Court has sued the New Manhattan Athletic Club and the Piquis Club Association, for \$400 for beer sold and delivered, January Van Wyck set the case for trial on April 25.
