

**CHARMED THE COURT.**

**Mrs. Mamie Gray Held in \$500, Charged with Policy Writing.**

**She Smiled So Mischievously that All Hands Were Sorry.**

**Reserves Her Story for a Higher Tribunal.**

Mrs. Mamie Gray, the attractive young woman who is accused of running an salting policy shop at 33 East Seventy-fifth street, was held under \$500 bail for trial by Justice Ryan in Yorkville Court to-day. Bonds were furnished by Adolph Jansen, Jr.

Mrs. Gray smiled in a fascinating way at Justice Ryan when called to the bar, but she reserved whatever story she has to tell for a higher tribunal.

She was dressed in a blue outing costume, wore diamond rings and a sailor hat tipped on one side in jaunty style. She did not appear to be in the least bit worried, and after the court officers had an opportunity to admire her, they all united in saying that it must be a pleasure to play policy, even when losing, when one so attractive as Mrs. Gray was dealing in "bliss" and "sadness."

Special Officer Miller, who arrested the young woman, told the Justice that he had found her seated by a table on which was the tell-tale manifold sheet, which has made her so much trouble.

"She was not writing," he said, "but was talking to two men."

"Did you arrest them," asked Justice Ryan.

"No," stammered the officer, "they didn't seem to be doing anything for which I could arrest them. They were just talking to this young woman," looking at the accused, to which she responded with a mischievous glance of reproach so amusing to spectators that even the Judge had to bite the ends of his moustache in order to preserve the dignity of the court.

Lawyer Stewart, who appeared for Mrs. Gray, maintained that the possession of a policy sheet was not a criminal offense.

"Well, maybe," said the Justice, "but I guess the circumstances warrant me in holding Mrs. Gray for a higher court."

**TWO GYPSIES ELOPE.**

Belong to Rival Camps and Are Overhauled in Connecticut.

RYE, N. Y., June 23.—Arthur Stanley, a member of the Stanley tribe of gypsies, eloped yesterday with Missouri Wells. She is sixteen years old and a daughter of William Wells, the head of another tribe. Stanley is leader in a tribe. There has been a bitter feeling between the two tribes for some time, as their courses appeared to conflict.

Arthur Stanley and the daughter of Chief Wells apparently took no part in the differences, and some time to-day left on a steam launch. They were taken to Bridgeport, Conn. Chief Wells discovered the flight of his daughter, and invoked the aid of the authorities to arrest her.

The Bridgeport police caught the runaway couple. The particulars of what transpired at Bridgeport were not known here. Chief Wells is about. The young couple are said to be in Greenwich, Conn., just across the State line.

At the camp of the Wells tribe here there is much feeling, but questions by outsiders are ignored, and seekers for information are referred to the chief.

**PILGRIMS GO ABROAD.**

They Will Visit the Scenes of Early Presbyterianism.

The steamship Berlin, of the American line, sailed this afternoon. She carried the Presbyterian pilgrims and a church music party, who are to visit the principal musical centres and Cathedral cities of England, France, Belgium and Holland.

The two parties, of 100 persons each, make their trips under the direction of Henry R. Elliott, who is associated with Rev. Henry M. Field, the veteran editor of The Evangelist. The entire cabin of the steamship was engaged.

The Presbyterian pilgrims will be landed at Queenstown, while the church music party will proceed to Southampton.

On Irish soil, the pilgrims will visit Protestant strongholds in the North, pass through the battle grounds where the fortunes of William of Orange and King James II. were decided, and rest their feet Sunday on shore in Belfast.

From London the course will be east via Canterbury, where the pilgrims will have an opportunity of observing the Presbyterian service that has been kept in the crypt of the Cathedral since the days of the early Huguenots. When Paris is reached the members will be given opportunity to go over the scenes of the St. Bartholomew's Eve massacre. The church music tourists will reach Salisbury in time for the morning service at the Cathedral. They will visit Worcester, where there will be a special service by the choir of eighteen members.

In London the tourists will be received by a committee of leading musicians. Thence they go on the Continent, returning home from Antwerp.

**MULQUEEN GETS THE MONEY.**

Ex-Major Gilroy's Son-in-Law Wins His Suit at Last.

Michael J. Mulqueen's bill for \$15,000 for services as counsel for Antonio Iastinas, receiver of the Canal Street Bank, will be paid in full, with an extra allowance of \$54 for interest and expenses. Mulqueen is a son-in-law of ex-Major Gilroy. After his appointment as receiver's counsel, it was alleged by some of the stockholders he secured the position through political influence.

The receiver paid three dividends to stockholders aggregating 50 per cent, and it is understood the remaining 10 per cent, will be paid shortly. Mulqueen was paid \$6,500 on account.

Stockholders objected to the payment of the full amount of \$15,000. Referee William J. Lardner reported in favor of allowing Mulqueen's bill in full.

Judge Dugro, in a decision handed down last night, has before his departure for Europe, confirms the receiver's report in which is incorporated the referee's report, giving Mulqueen \$9,544.
