

SAW CORBETT KISS VERA. Miss King Testifies for the Champion's Wife in Her Suit for Divorce.

VERA KNOWN AS MRS. CORBETT. On One Occasion the Witness Saw Her Head Resting on Jim's Shoulder.

BETRAYED BY A NEWSPAPER. The Real Wife Read of Her Husband and Mrs. C. Registered at a Cincinnati Hotel.

The taking of testimony in the suit for absolute divorce brought by Mrs. James J. Corbett, wife of the champion pugilist, was continued to-day before Referee Edward Jacobs, at his office, 225 Broadway.

Mrs. Corbett, who wants permission to resume her maiden name of Ollie Lake, arrived with her lawyer promptly at 11:30 o'clock. Miss Mary King, who testified at the last hearing in favor of Mrs. Corbett, came in with her.

Miss King was a member of "Gentle-mans Jim's" theatrical company and she was the conductor of the prize-fighter's act with a woman known as "Vera," who the company was on the road. Corbett was represented by Lawyer Sullivan.

Mrs. Corbett, with a neat straw hat and sailor costume, looked pretty and interesting as she stepped into the referee's room. She held in her hand a copy of a Cincinnati paper of April 24, which contained an account of her husband having registered at a hotel there with "Mrs. Corbett," the latter being Vera.

As she read her eyes flashed and handing the paper to Abe Hummel she asked him to get it admitted in evidence. Like a dutiful lawyer, he said he would try, but was doubtful about succeeding.

Her sister's defense in a suit for slander brought by Mrs. Catherine Williams, who claimed \$50,000 damages, was made by Mrs. Robinson. She also claims that Mrs. Robinson conveyed the property.

Had Not Learned that His Wife Had Become a Mother. Henry Engelhelm, thirty-six years old and reported wealthy, went suddenly insane at his home, One Hundred and Sixty-seventh street, and was committed to the asylum on July 10.
