

STUCK FAST IN ICE.

Dr. Nansen's Fram Supposed to Be the Vessel Sighted.

The Ship Carried an Expedition of North-Pole Seekers.

Sailed in '93 and Thought to Be Now off Greenland's Coast.

LONDON, Sept. 17.—Advises have been received here from the Danish trading station of Angmagalik, on the east coast of Greenland, that a ship, supposed to be Dr. Fridtjof Nansen's Fram, was sighted late in July, stuck fast in an ice drift.

Dr. Nansen's expedition to the North Pole sailed from Christiansia, Norway, June 23, 1893.

The intention was to make for the New Siberian Islands, thence sail directly north till the Fram should be imbedded in the ice, then drift along with it, following the west coast any land that might be met.

On Aug. 23, 1893, Dr. Nansen sent word from the Ugorski Straits that he was about to sail into the Kara Sea, and that so far the Fram had behaved splendidly in the ice.

A letter, which was dated at Kjolofjord, Feb. 24, 1895, reached Hammerfest, Norway, announcing that a telegraph inspector at a mountain station between Lebesby and Langford had seen a light moving in a southeasterly direction and heard the sound of a steamship.

The Fram is a vessel of 500 tons burden, rigged as a three-masted schooner and provided with a steam engine of 100 horse-power. She was built especially for Dr. Nansen at Laurvig, near Christiansia.

The Norwegian Parliament gave Dr. Nansen about \$2,000 in aid of his expedition, and many private subscriptions, including one of over \$5,000 from King Oscar, were added to the fund.

The cabin of the ship was to be heated by means of an oil-burner, and a stove, consuming three liters of petroleum a day. A sufficient supply of this fuel to last eight or nine years was taken on board when the expedition sailed.

NO STEAMSHIP SUNK. Rumor About a North German Lloyd Steamer is Unfounded.

BERLIN, Sept. 17.—The rumor which was in circulation here last night, that a North German Lloyd steamship had been sunk, with 150 persons on board, has been proven to be unfounded.

The report that a North German Lloyd steamer had been lost at sea did not seem to create any uneasiness at the office of the company in this city this morning. Manager Herman Winter said:

"We place no credit in this report, at least so far as the steamers of the transatlantic line are concerned. All the boats of that line have been accounted for satisfactorily."

HALIFAX, N. S., Sept. 16.—A large vessel is reported ashore on Sambro Ledges, a short distance down the coast. Tugs have gone there. Her name is not known.

WORKING AGAINST CHOLERA.

San Francisco Authorities Will Take No Chances.

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 17.—Three vessels are at the quarantine station at Angel Island. They are the Pacific Mail steamer City of Rio de Janeiro, the Honolulu-Packets Steamship Company's Alton and the British ship Merioneth.

The Government authorities are hard at work fumigating passengers and vessels. When the Rio de Janeiro left Nagasaki the cholera was prevailing, and in two weeks there had been 71 cases and 51 deaths.

At Yokohama there was cholera, but, according to the captain, it was not the city, but inland. In two weeks there had been forty-seven cases and thirty-five deaths.

On arriving at Honolulu the steamer anchored in the outer harbor, and did not have any communication with the shore, except by boat. At the time the cholera was prevailing, the steamer was signed by Eli M. King, the Consul-General.

While in the outer harbor, the steamer was fumigated with sulphur. After listening to this statement and examining the papers offered in substantiation, Dr. Chambers gave it as his opinion that as there had been several days had elapsed since the steamer left Honolulu there was no possibility of the cholera being carried after all the fumigation, and in spite of all the precautionary taken.

He went to see the Board of Health, and was overruled by that body, which recommended the steamer to be quarantined at the island.

LIEUT. STEVENS'S RIDE.

An Army Report of Roads in the Shenandoah Valley.

Covered with the mud of several States, Lieut. G. W. B. Stevens, of the First United States Artillery, presented himself before Gen. Jarrico, on Governor's Island this morning, and submitted his report of the condition of the roads between this city and the Shenandoah Valley, and the feasibility of rapidly moving troops and bicycles over them.

In his report the Lieutenant states that the roads in Maryland are awful, and that a number of the people whom he met did not volunteer information very cheerfully. On this trip the Lieutenant has covered about 900 miles. He covered the distance from Washington to New York, 248 miles, in forty-eight hours, being thirty hours on the road.

His actual riding time being twenty-three hours. So far this year Stevens has ridden 9,000 miles on army business.

Big Record for House of Relief. During the seven days ending Sunday, the House of Relief, 42 Hudson street, broke the record for ambulance service. Ninety-four calls were answered, the largest number ever handled in a week.

This week was done with only three ambulances and two attendants. It was surpassed by but one day in the history of the institution, June 12, 1935, when thirty-five calls were answered.
