HIS TESTIMONY BEFORE CORONER READ IN COURT

Assistant District Attorney Osborne said this afternoon after adjournment of the Molineux trial: "The case for the prosecution will surely be finished before the noon recess to-morrow."



Mr. Osborne, it is believed, insisted upon his point because he does not think the defense will dare to put Molineux on the witness stand in his own behalf.
