LONDON, March 8.—The Queen's entry into London to-day and the commencement of her visit to the metropolis were marked by scenes of enthusiasm unparalleled since the Jubilee celebration.

HUGE CROWD AT PALACE.

By noon it was estimated that 50,000 people were gathered about the Queen's town residence, waiting patiently.
