

BOY PIRATES STOLE BRIDE.

Three Boys Captured in Woods Charged With Kidnapping Girl.

Thirteen-year-old Goldie Phillips, of Riverhead, L. I., who sailed away last Saturday on the sloop Flyaway with three boys, the eldest being nineteen, is a bride.

The boy-leader of the pirate crew, Vernon Moore, married the child at Galveston, six miles from Riverhead, last night.

Sheriff Wells said: "I have learned that the Flyaway put into Galveston, six miles west of Riverhead, last night, and Goldie Phillips and Moore were married by a clergyman named Lane, who is about eighty years old and has a regular charge. Somebody is going to get into serious trouble."

Vernon Moore, Virgil Way and John Dutcher, the three young men of Riverhead, whose ages range from seventeen to nineteen years, and who it is alleged kidnapped the girl by enticing her on board the sloop, were arrested this morning in the woods back of Riverhead.

They were taken before Justice George Buckingham. Vernon Moore then admitted that he was married to Goldie Phillips last night by the Rev. O. C. Lane, pastor of the Methodist Church at Salverton.

On being questioned by Justice Buckingham, Moore said he did not know why he had consented to marry the girl and his companions allege that the girl went with them voluntarily.

The Justice adjourned the case to give the prisoners an opportunity to secure bail and counsel.

Goldie Phillips, or Mrs. Moore, is but thirteen years of age and the daughter of William S. Phillips. She is well developed and has the appearance of being older than she really is.

On Thursday last she left home to go to school at Aqueduct. She did not return home that afternoon, and she was not seen again until Sunday afternoon, when she boarded the sloop yacht Flyaway, which was moored at the town dock.

The boys, it is alleged, were with the girl when the yacht sailed in the direction of Peconic Bay.

Mrs. Phillips, the mother of the girl, obtained warrants from Justice Buckingham for the arrest of the three young men.

Sheriff Wells and a squad of his deputies started out in pursuit of the alleged kidnapers and their fair captive, and after an all-day search, arrested Moore and his two companions.

The girl has also been located, and Justice Buckingham said she would be produced in court at the proper time.

The District-Attorney of the county will prosecute the case.

CROKER'S CO. CANNOT BOND

Comptroller Bars Freedman's Guarantee Company.

Comptroller Coler has stricken the United States Fidelity and Guarantee Company, of which Andrew Freedman is Vice-President, and in which Richard Croker has admitted he has an interest.

Croker has admitted he has an interest, from the list of sureties acceptable to the city upon bonds of officials and contractors engaged upon municipal work.

"I'm too busy with school matters," said Comptroller Coler to an Evening World reporter this morning, "to talk about 'bonds' or anything else."

"Is it true that you have refused to accept any more bonds of the Freedman company?"

"I don't know how it got out, but it is true that their bonds will not be accepted by the city until the company pays the city what is due it."

Mr. Coler's temerity has sent cold shivers through Tammany. The Comptroller says the company has failed to make good for a contractor who failed to carry out his agreement with the city. Under this obligation, amounting to nearly \$60,000, is satisfied Mr. Coler says the Croker-Freedman company shall get no business.

The Armstrong & Bolton Company, by their bid of \$12,500, obtained the contract for erecting the steam and electrical plants in the new Tombs Building. Their figures were \$13,000 below the next lowest bidder. The United States Fidelity and Guarantee Company signed their bond of \$50,000 to protect the city against loss in case the contract should not be fulfilled.
