U. S. AND BRITISH CONSULS WIN POINT.

TIENTSIN, China, Sunday, June 10.—But for the firmness of the United States Consul, Capt. McCalla, of the Newark, and the British Consul there would have been further delay in despatching the International Guards to Peking and the majority of the forces would not have been British.

LONDON, June 11.—Russia has been unmasked in China! The Empress Dowager has fled to the Czar's legation in Peking, a despatch from Tien-Tsin reports.

600 BRITISH TROOPS TRAPPED BY BOERS.

Only Six Soldiers Escape Out of Battalion Defending Post in the Rooodeval Raid.



LONDON, June 11.—Lieut.-Gen. Sir Frederick Forester-Walker, in command of the lines of communication in South Africa, reports a disaster to the British troops on June 7, at Rooodeval, where the Boers out Lord Roberts's line of communication.

500 MEN CAUGHT.

It is inferred that the Boers captured over 500 men, and as late as June 10 held positions cutting off the British forces north of Kroonstadt from reinforcements.

MANY KILLED.

Gen. Forester-Walker's despatch in full is as follows: "CAPE TOWN, June (Sunday) 10.—The following telegram has been received from Charles Knox: "Kroonstadt.—The following casualties, reported from Rooodeval June 7, received from Statham, commanding the Imperial Yeomanry Hospital, dated Rooodeval River, June 8, received here by flag of truce June 10: The Fourth Battalion of the Derbyshire Regiment (the Sherwood Foresters)—Killed, Lieut.-Col. Baird-Douglas and Lieut. Hawley and fifteen of the rank and file."


