EUROPE EAGERLY WAITS ON DECISION OF M'KINLEY.

ROME, July 19.—The Government has received a circular from M. Delcasse, the French Minister of Foreign Affairs, which has been despatched to all the powers proposing an international agreement for joint action in China and the future attitude of the powers.

W. W. ROCKHILL TO REPORT ON CRISIS.

ROCKHILL IS NAMED. EUROPE EAGERLY WAITS ON DECISION OF M'KINLEY.

WASHINGTON, July 19.—The Cabinet meeting to-day developed nothing of importance regarding the Chinese situation beyond a decision to send W. W. Rockhill, formerly Secretary of the Legation at Peking and Assistant Secretary of State and now Chief of the Bureau of American Republics, to China to investigate the situation and report to the authorities here.
