WOMAN BURGLAR AGAIN IN TOILS.

Mrs. Bremer Arrested as She Is Leaving Blackwell's Island.

With a husband who is said to be an honest man, three small children and the prospect of motherhood before her, Ida Bremer, thirty-three years old, comely and intelligent, was arraigned in the Butler Street (Brooklyn) Police Court before Justice Kramer to-day and charged with burglary.

Mrs. Bremer quietly denied the charge and was sent to the Long Island College Hospital without bail.

According to the Brooklyn police Mrs. Bremer has a natural predilection for burglary.

She was arrested yesterday as she was about to leave Blackwell's Island, where she had just completed a three months term.

The woman's history and the story of her first arrest is of unusual interest. In the Spring and Summer of 1899 the Brooklyn police were puzzled to discover the perpetrator of numerous burglaries in Third avenue.

Houses and flats were robbed daily, but they could not catch the burglar.

Entered Policeman's House.

On the afternoon of June 12 Policeman Mulhally went to his home, 417 Third avenue, to take a nap. His wife went out. As he lay dozing he heard somebody fumbling at the lock of the front door. He waited, and in a few minutes Mrs. Bremer entered his flat as quietly and unobservedly as if it were her own home.

"Here, who are you and what's up?" asked Mulhally.

"Why, I must have made a mistake. I thought this was my sister's flat," said Mrs. Bremer smiling and turning to walk out.

But Mulhally was suspicious, for he saw that she carried a great bunch of keys in her hand.

He arrested her, and when her home at 283acket street was searched the police found that it contained enough household and other goods to stock a small store.

Had Robbed Man.

These articles were identified by persons in Brooklyn who had been robbed, and Mrs. Bremer was held in \$500 bail on a charge of burglary.

She obtained the bail and subsequently disappeared. Her husband said that he did not know where she went, and it was not until she was arrested in Manhattan for a small burglary that they obtained news of her.

To her Blackwell street neighbors Mrs. Bremer was known as a model wife and mother with domestic tastes.

RICE INQUEST IS POSTPONED

Valet Jones Said to Be Ready with Second Confession.

The inquest into the death of William Marsh Rice was again postponed to-day. The hearing will take place in about a week. It is announced that Valet Charles P. Jones, who made a confession according to the coroner's jury, is preparing another statement, differing from his first and setting the true story as to how he came to make it.

The new statement, it is said, will contain some startling facts and show that it was a woman who induced the valet to tell things which in the shape of Mr. Osborne gave the coroner's jury the impression that the valet was a accomplice in the murder of the millionaire.

The valet's statement was not made until after the coroner's jury had returned its verdict and the inquest was adjourned.

TOOK WIFE'S DIAMONDS.

Blind Walter Said Jewels Were a Gift, but Had to Return Them.

Peter Zauner, of 133 East Seventeenth street, was accused in the Yorkville Court before Magistrate May on this morning by his wife Mary, now living at 320 East Sixteenth street, of the theft of 300 worth of diamonds and other jewelry.

Zauner lost his sight through illness ten months ago and his wife left him. He was a waiter in McGurk's, on the Bowery, when he married her nine years ago.

She said his wife met him on the street last week and she agreed to give him the diamonds.

Zauner promised to return the property, but a detective was sent with him to the house at 133 East Sixteenth street to return him if he restored the jewels.
