CLERK STOLE \$190,000.

MAYOR FLOOD, OF ELMIRA, ARRESTED FOR FORGERY.

Was Implicated by Catherine Looie in Forgery for Which She Was Sentenced to Four Years and Nine Months in Prison.

Girl Pleaded Guilty, but Alderman McCann Started Inquiry and Then Made Charges Against the Executive.



(Special to The Evening World.) ELMIRA, N. Y., Nov. 12.—Recorder Michael Danaher issued a warrant at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon, charging Dr. Frank H. Flood, the Mayor of the city of Elmira, with forgery in the first degree upon complaint of Alderman Francis J. McCann.

Dr. Flood was arrested at 2:45 o'clock by City Detective Grand and is now in jail. He is charged with being implicated in the Miss Catherine Looie forgery.

Social and political circles here were astounded to-day when it was learned through the exclusive publication of The World that Dr. Frank H. Flood, Mayor of Elmira, had been accused of forgery.

The failure of Grant Brothers, stock brokers, at 45 Broadway, was announced to-day and the most sensational feature of it was the rumor, which the brokers refused either to affirm or deny, that their confidential man had stolen \$100,000.

It is said that the liabilities of the concern are about \$100,000. When the failure was announced this afternoon it was understood that it was a small one and that the firm had really been inoperative for some time.
