

KENNEDY JURY UNABLE TO REACH AN AGREEMENT.

On behalf of the State, that the defendant will be tried again. Justice Furman then resumed. "I wish to thank you personally for your attention and now discharge you. The jurors started to rise. Juror No. 1, William J. Wallace, leaned over to Foreman Klaber. No one knew what was said, but the action was noted. As the men rose, Dr. Kennedy looked at each of them save Foreman Klaber. His eyes had never left the latter's face. He sat with his hands on his knees, his head bowed, his face pale as death. The young man's thoughts were at that particular moment in the court room.

Kennedy Dazed. After the jurors passed him Kennedy stood as one dazed. Every part of his life and hope had passed on this day. His father grasped his hand and said "Never mind, Sam."

The Hopeful Wife. "I know," she said, "we have not lost you, and for that let us be thankful. I will yet have you back home, and I, for one, will never forsake you." Kennedy's counsel and Mr. McIntyre were conferring. An appeal will be made to-morrow. Kennedy admitted to all. "I have not lost courage," said Mr. McIntyre. Then turning to the reporters he announced: "You may be sure that Kennedy will surely be tried again. I don't say that I will try him, but it is official that he will be tried and in the Court of General Sessions."
