Reduced Rates to Washington

Magistrate Declares He Will Find Out Gambling - Place Owners Himself and Have Them Raided by the Police.

Repeats His Advice to "Smash" a Way Into Gaming Resorts—Says It's Up to the Mayor to Stop Vice.

Magistrate Crane announced from the bench of the Harlem Court to-day that he is going to make a crusade against vice himself. He will be supported by no one, but will take up the crusade alone. He will confine himself to gambling-houses.

When Joseph Daniels, of No. 114 Park avenue, who leased the place on Park avenue which Capt. Flood raided as a gambling-house, appeared in court Magistrate Crane, who had expressed a desire to see him and had him summoned, said:

"How is it you let gambling go on there?" "I don't know anything about it," responded Daniels. "I only lease the place from a man named Baxter."
