PIERRE LORILLARD'S WILL IS NOT TO BE CONTESTED.



Chancellor Magie, Who Will Prove Instrument Next Tuesday, Has Been So Informed—Mrs. Allien Takes Possession of Ranocosa, Prepared to Defend Her Claim.

Chancellor Magie, at Trenton, N. J., announced this afternoon that he would be at the State House on Thursday next to prove the will of the late Pierre Lorillard, over which, he has been informed, there is to be no contest.

In order to protect her rights in Ranocosa Stock Farm, left to her by Pierre Lorillard's will, Mrs. Lillian Allien took possession of the property today. She is now entrenched, with gates locked and guarded, and any attempt on the part of Mr. Lorillard's widow or children to remove her is likely to be attended with sensational happenings.

The move of Mrs. Allien in taking possession of Ranocosa indicates that she is not as willing as was thought to give up the great stock farm for a consideration. She is just as much attached to the property as the Lorillards are.


