Policeman, on Force Twelve Years, Summarily Dismissed.

Body Lying in State in the Court-House Viewed by Tearful Thousands, While the Widow, Who Has Borne Up with Sublime Fortitude, Is Almost Prostrated at Her Home.

Thousands of tearful townsmen and visitors are viewing the body of William McKinley, which after a thousand-mile journey from Buffalo to Washington and to his Ohio home, now lies in state in the Court-House at Canton.

The body will be removed at 9 o'clock to-night to the McKinley residence, where the widow, who stood the journey from Washington with admirable fortitude, is well-nigh prostrated. As she stepped from the funeral train, home at last among her old friends, she broke into sobs.
